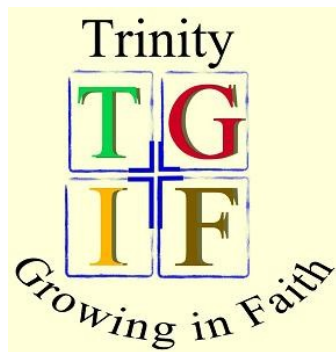

TRINITY FINANCIAL REPORT - SEPTEMBER 30, 2011

The Wardens are pleased to advise as follows:

Year to Date

Revenue \$228,809.08

Expenses \$218,176.50

The surplus, from the foregoing, together with funds from a matured investment certificate were used to retire \$20,000 that was owing to the Diocese from 2010. Included in our receipts is a generous donation of \$6,000.00 from an anonymous donor. Thanks also to Shirley Vernon and Jean Noy for their financial support for the tree removal project. The concrete steps have been finished. A new hand railing will be installed very soon. Also, as you may have seen, the main entrance to our church has been beautifully restored! Although not as interesting, we are proceeding with a financial audit; as required by the Canons.
