Biblical Leadership -- Lessons From Ephesians

In July, Fr. Andrew preached through the first half of St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians. In August Canon Brian will continue with the second half of Ephesians examining various aspects of leadership. Many Christians would claim that they are not leaders and that they have no leadership skills. They don't see themselves in front of a group and feel quite shy. It may surprise us that there are many ways in which we are leaders. We will explore four of these aspects in August. It would be helpful for you to read Ephesians in the New Testament and particularly the selected verses for each Sunday as indicated below. As you read these selections consider the practical implications for your own life.

- August 9th **LEADERSHIP OF SELF** (Ephesians 4:22 - 5:2)
- August 16th **LEADERSHIP IN MARRIAGE** (Ephesians 5:21 - 33)
- August 23rd **LEADERSHIP IN FAMILY** (Ephesians 6: 1-4)
- August 30th **LEADERSHIP IN MINISTRY** (Ephesians 4: 11 - 16)

QUOTE OF THE DAY -- Leadership of Self.

During a Q&A session at a conference, someone asked, "What has been your greatest challenge as a leader?" "Leading me!" I answered. "That has always been my greatest challenge as a leader." Some in the audience were surprised by my response. The more experienced leaders were not. Like me, they could trace many of their failures to their own personal mismanagement. Isn't that also true for you? If I could kick the person responsible for my problems, I wouldn't be able to sit down for a week!

Look in the Mirror: Learning to lead yourself well is one of the most important things you'll ever do. For almost forty years I've served others as a leader, and for more than two and a half decades of that time I was the senior pastor of a church. My years working with people have taught me an important truth: people seldom see themselves realistically. Human nature seems to endow us with the ability to size up everybody in the world except ourselves. That's why my book "Winning with People" begins with the Mirror Principle: "The first person we must examine is ourselves." If you don't look at yourself realistically, you will never understand where your personal difficulties are coming from.

Most people use two totally different sets of criteria for judging themselves and judging others. We tend to judge others according to their actions. It's very cut-and-dried. However, we judge ourselves by our intentions. Even if we do the wrong thing, we let ourselves off the hook if we believe our intentions are good. That's part of the reason we allow ourselves to make the same mistakes over and over again before we are willing to make real changes.

WATERFORD MINISTRY -- “CHOSEN SOLDIER PROJECT”

Each month a team from Trinity (led by Val Marrow) leads a worship service at the Waterford Retirement Home. One of the projects they have recently undertaken is to send a care-package to a Canadian soldier in Afghanistan. The second parcel they sent was blessed at the Canada Day Service on July 8th and below is the letter of thanks they received from Lieutenant G.R. (Greg) McDonald. Enough money has been raised to send another parcel in August. Our thanks to the ministry team for their great work at Waterford and for this wonderful outreach project!

Dear Val,

I received your package today and was happily surprised. I would like to thank everyone in the Waterford Retirement Community and Trinity Anglican Church for this very nice and morale boosting gesture. I divided all the gifts up between the members of “B Troop” to everyone's enjoyment. I wish you could have seen the look on everyone's face when they saw the can of Tim Horton's coffee (everyone's favourite coffee)! Now I'd like to tell you a little bit about my team of soldiers over here.

B Troop is responsible for the satellite communications which enables us to provide computer networks and telephones to the soldiers over here in Afghanistan. We are currently split up into four groups spread out across Afghanistan and the Middle East to better provide these services. I work out of the Kandahar Airfield, commonly referred to as "KAF", with 14 of my soldiers and we are lucky enough to have a Tim Horton's on base here. The rest of my soldiers (5 in Kabul, 6 in Kandahar City and 9 in the Middle East) unfortunately do not have a Tim Horton's with them, so we'll make sure they each get some coffee from the can that you sent us. The temperature reaches up to 55 degrees Celcius daily, but don't worry, it won't keep us away from our Timmies!

All of my soldiers, except for 2, are deployed from the Canadian Forces Joint Signals Regiment in Kingston, ON. As for the other 2, one is deployed from North Bay, ON and the other one is deployed from Victoria, BC. We arrived in Afghanistan in late May and will be returning home just before Christmas, thankfully allowing all of my soldiers to be with their loved ones over the winter holidays.

Again, I would like to thank you all for your very thoughtful gifts, words of encouragement and kind prayers. Sincerely,
