NEARLY NEW SALE / GARAGE SALE

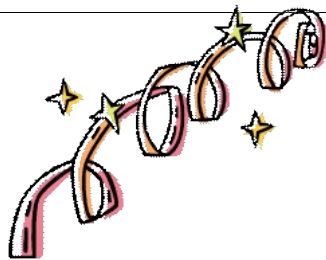
