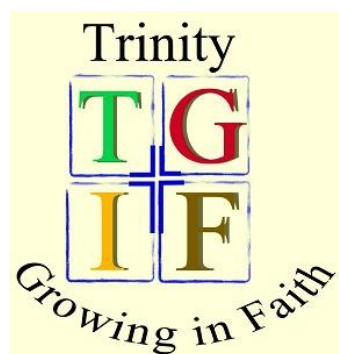

## SERMON NOTES -- Gifts of the Spirit

As part of our spring preaching series on the Holy Spirit we looked at the gifts of the Holy Spirit listed in the New Testament. These gifts are given to all believers. In Matthew 10 Jesus sends out the 12 disciples to undertake the same ministry as he is doing. In Exodus 18 Moses takes the advise of his father-in-law and appoints good people to share his work of leadership. In Romans 12 Paul lists a number of the gifts of the Holy Spirit and various acts of service.

We are blessed at Trinity to have many ministry teams who use their gifts and provide service in wonderful and varied ways. This morning we want to thank and celebrate the work of two of these ministries: Retirement Home Worship Teams and our Home Group leaders. The Rev. Ray Carder leads monthly worship services in 6 Retirement Homes and there are several people who help him with music and with Communion. When Victoria Village and the Waterford opened they also requested regular worship services. Val Marrow has led a wonderful worship team in these two residences with Canon Brian and Fr. Andrew providing Communion. Their names are listed on page 2 and we thank them for this wonderful ministry.

This past year we have had a great series of Home Groups beginning with ALPHA last fall. The leaders of the groups are skillful in teaching from the Bible, in facilitating prayer and kindling friendships within the groups. This is a vital opportunity to grow in the faith and to feel a part of the congregation. Our thanks to all our leaders and helpers this past winter and spring. On Monday evenings Stacy Marshall and Marnie Smith have provided worship, and Norm Marrow, Joanne Sugg, and Bonnie Whitnall have set up refreshments and assisted in the kitchen.
