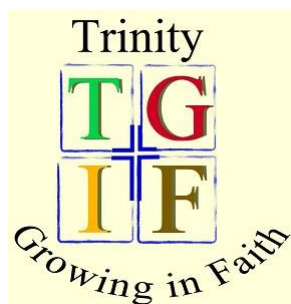

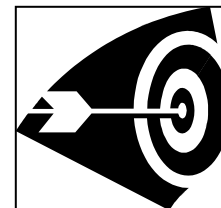


VACATION BIBLE CAMP (VBC) July 5 to 9 “High Seas Expedition: Exploring the Mighty Love of God”

PASSPORT TO ADVENTURE SERIES

This is our final Sunday for regular Sunday School, and our topic is so appropriate “Choosing to Tell Others About Jesus.” We will look at the story of Andrew, and what motivated him to want to share the Good News. [John 1:35-49] Our Bible Verse is taken from Romans 1:16 “I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes.”

Our “Chosen Soldier” Boxes Offer Troops a Touch of Home

Thank you for those who contributed to “CHOSEN SOLDIER”. To date we at Trinity have contributed \$300, and from Waterford \$90. We will have a small surplus and will apply it to the boxes we will ship out at Remembrance Day.

This week we are blessing our “Chosen Soldier” Boxes that will be soon on their way to Afghanistan. Three boxes are Trinity’s contribution this time and one is from the residents of Waterford Retirement Home.

The impact of receiving a box—estimated to be close to \$75.00 in value—can make a tremendous impact not only for the soldier, but for the unit and even the native population, as well. "Receiving a package is also a huge boost for morale," reports a “Chosen Soldier” who is back after his second tour of duty in Afghanistan. "Some soldiers don't receive anything at all in their time shipped out. So when they get a package, it's unbelievable. It shows our troops that Canadians really do care and you're not forgotten. Canada is proud of you."

We filled the boxes with personal care items—such as baby wipes, shampoo, hand soap, toothpaste and deodorant; much-loved food items, M&M’s, almonds, popcorn, gum and other snacks; some reading materials, a deck of cards, We enclose a can of Tim Horton’s coffee which is always received with great enthusiasm. Most boxes are shared with others in the unit, so they often go quickly, some items more than others. Personal hygiene items are especially prized due to the weather and often unexpected traveling. This time we packed a Military Bible that has the following personal greeting written in the front cover. We trust the “Good News” will also be shared.

Dear Brother in Christ:

May this Bible be a lamp for your feet and light unto your path. (Ps. 119:105.) We are praying for you every week. The people and pastors of Trinity Church, Barrie. Ontario.

As I write this article we have just received the news that another Canadian soldier has been killed in Afghanistan. Sgt. James MacNeil, 28, of Glace Bay, Nova Scotia, was killed by an improvised explosive device this morning near the village of Nakhonay after he had dismounted from his armoured vehicle. MacNeil is the 148th Canadian soldier to die in Afghanistan since Canada's mission began there in 2002. This is such a tragedy and we grieve. Please pray for Sgt MacNeil’s family.

Please pray for our four Chosen Soldiers and their families. They are Cpl N. Walker, Pte A.C. Bowers, TPR B.K. Campbell, and Cpl D.S. Slade. Pray also for those soldiers in Afghanistan who are related to our parish family. They are: Capt. Chris Herton, Eddie George, Evan Gorman, and Jason.
