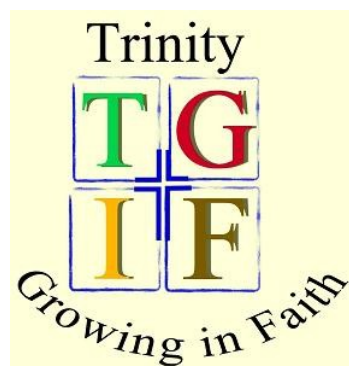

Meals on Wheels

The Barrie Red Cross takes on new clients every day. We are currently serving 360 meals per week or approx. 1300 meals a month. This service allows people to remain in their homes, rather than enter a nursing home. It allows a Senior to remain independent longer. We use 13 volunteers a night for 5 days a week (meals to cover Sat. & Sun. are delivered on Fri.). Trinity delivers meals to Seniors once every six weeks on a Wednesday. (Either being the 'driver' or 'runner'). We'd love to have more volunteers from Trinity on our 'spare list' Please call Mary Caldwell, 728-2691, if you are interested in this cause.

ALL SAINTS DAY

While the church has set aside certain days during the year to remember well-known saints, there is a whole company of martyrs and faithful believers who do not have a designated day in the church calendar. Therefore today, on ALL SAINTS DAY, we celebrate all those who have kept the faith and entered into God's eternal kingdom. All Saints is a time for us to remember the heavenly glory that God has prepared



for his people. We are reminded in the scriptures that in heaven God "will wipe away every tear from their eyes and death shall be no more". (Rev. 21:4) All Saints day is also a time for us to give thanks for the loved ones we have known in whom the light and presence of God shone. We pray that the Lord will comfort us and strengthen us in the midst of the grief we feel at their passing from us. It is also a time for us to pray that we will be faithful followers of Jesus in our own day. With the author of Hebrews we pray, that, "since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight and sin which clings so closely and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated on the right hand of the throne of God". All Saints is full of meaning for God's people as we cast our gaze heavenwards.
