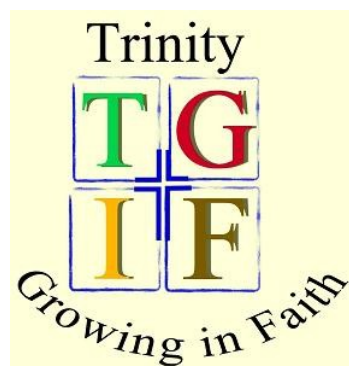

## HOLLYWOOD NOTES

### -- "EXPELLED"

Ben Stein's docu/drama called "Expelled" played in the theaters this spring and has just been released on DVD. With lots of comic interludes this movie highlights the recent debate over Darwin and the scientists who have been expelled from their positions for questioning Darwin's theories. It features Princeton scientist David Berlinski and includes several interviews with best selling author Richard Dawkins. This movie profiles the strong case being made by scientists today for the Intelligent Design of the universe. This is an excellent introduction to the debate for high school and university students and their parents.



\*\* In an unrelated development, the National Post newspaper carried a feature article on Darwin on Friday Oct. 31st called "Darwin? That's Just the Party Line" by journalist Wayne Eyre. It also features professor David Berlinski who writes, "Suspensions about Darwin's theory arise for two reasons "The first: The theory makes little sense. The second: It is supported by little evidence." In his dissection of Darwinists and Darwinism, Berlinski notes that "if biologists are wrong about Darwin, they are wrong about life, and if they are
